FW: BRACE and backlog cases Subject

As discussed on the telephone I have just received a copy of guidance that was issued on Weds Instructing caseworkers to work ring-fenced backlogs in Croydon and Sheffield under full consideration rather than Brace. In the current discurstances I think the Minister will want to be aware that this guidance has been issued. Should it, for any reason, reach the media we face the erroneous interpretation that this represents a concession that all BRACE work was in some way inappropriate rather than that it is appropriate to take this precentionary step given the fact that Ken Sutton's Investigation is ongoing and the issue is the subject of ongoing discussions.

Should this guidance become public I would suggest our line should be.

Government has ordered a full investigation of how it came about that guidance was issued Sovernment in a district a trull investigation of the limitigration and Nationality Directorate on the handling of applications under the European Union Accession agreements without Minister's knowledge or that of senior IND management which will cover the way in which backlogs of general casework have been handled. In the meentine all cases are receiving the same level of

Does this mean BRACE has been suspended?

As promised

You are aware that BRACE is the subject of on-going discussions with the Minister. Until we have further instruction, Paula Higson has edvised that the original ring-fonced backleg cases that still reside in Croydon and Sheffield should

be worked under full consideration, in the same way as caseworkers would deal with recent cases. These cases should be worked before any cases arriving more recently and not counted in our original backlog. I have asked out in Croydon between caseworkers so they can be cleared without further delay. Sheffield have confirmed they are already doing this and expect to clear their share of these old backlog cases as econ as enquiries are complete. Altogether there are in the region of 300 such cases split between Sheffield and Croydon.

This leaves pre-August 2003 cases which have been newly received in General Group since 1 January 2004, (when I said they should be counted separately from our original backlog). These cases should also be worked under full consideration, pending further instructions. When the present investigation has reported and people have more time to look forward, work will need to be done on the consideration that needs to be given these newly arrived cases that produce 1 August 2003 which are surfacing at the rate of about 150 per week in General Group 2.

A proper instruction will be issued as soon as it can be drafted and agreed. For the time being please work on the basis of this note, the content of which has been discussed with Paula
